## **No Challengers for Peachtree Corners City Council Members**

PEACHTREE CORNERS, Ga. -- The Peachtree Corners City Council has only been in place for about a year and a half, but city residents obviously approve of their performance. The three-day qualifying period ended Wednesday and no one stepped forward to challenge council members Weare Gratwick (Post 6), Jeanne Aulbach (Post 4) and Jay Lowe (Post 2).

Mayor Mike Mason said, "This is great news! I believe it is a vote of confidence not only in our incumbents but also in the progress of the City, We are on the right track!"

There has been tremendous progress in the last year, including the elimination of a city millage rate, reduced cost of trash collection and giving city residents control of their own destiny, particularly in the area of planning and zoning. After a series of informational meetings, city council is working to adopt a comprehensive land use plan.

Aulbach thanked residents for their confidence in the group. "We still have a lot of work to do and I am looking forward to what we can accomplish in the next four years."

Lowe also expressed his thanks.

"I hope this means people are very satisfied with the job we're doing," he said. "I set out to lead with integrity, trust and respect, and hopefully this is a referendum on the fact that's happening."
